

God's Calling Requirements
Part 30

“1 Judge me, O LORD; for I have walked in mine integrity: I have trusted also in the LORD; therefore I shall not slide. 2 Examine me, O LORD, and prove me; try my reins and my heart. 3 For thy lovingkindness is before mine eyes: and I have walked in thy truth. 4 I have not sat with vain persons, neither will I go in with dissemblers. 5 I have hated the congregation of evil doers; and will not sit with the wicked. 6 I will wash mine hands in innocency: so will I compass thine altar, O LORD: 7 That I may publish with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all thy wondrous works. 8 LORD, I have loved the habitation of thy house, and the place where thine honour dwelleth. 9 Gather not my soul with sinners, nor my life with bloody men: 10 In whose hands is mischief, and their right hand is full of bribes. 11 But as for me, I will walk in mine integrity: redeem me, and be merciful unto me. 12 My foot standeth in an even place: in the congregations will I bless the LORD.” (Psalm 26:1-12 KJV)

“1 Vindicate me, LORD, for I have led a blameless life; I have trusted in the LORD and have not faltered. 2 Test me, LORD, and try me, examine my heart and my mind; 3 for I have always been mindful of your unfailing love and have lived in reliance on your faithfulness. 4 I do not sit with the deceitful, nor do I associate with hypocrites. 5 I abhor the assembly of evildoers and refuse to sit with the wicked. 6 I wash my hands in innocence, and go about your altar, LORD, 7 proclaiming aloud your praise and telling of all your wonderful deeds. 8 LORD, I love the house where you live, the place where your glory dwells. 9 Do not take away my soul along with sinners, my life with those who are bloodthirsty, 10 in whose hands are wicked schemes, whose right hands are full of bribes. 11 I lead a blameless life; deliver me and be merciful to me. 12 My feet stand on level ground; in the great congregation I will praise the LORD.” (Psalm 26:1-12 NIV)

While you are living and doing the call of God in your life, there will be trials, opposition, persecution, work of devil, conspiracy, wax and wane in battles, you might be exhausted, burnt out, tempted even, your attitudes and character might change, your relationships with the people around you might be affected, people would leave you, others attack you and some others criticize you. With all that the picture might be not clear to you and you will start to look and observe yourself, the people, and the circumstances around you. You would surely be pressurized by all that, and at this moment you would cry as David cried to God in **Psalm 26**.

1 Judge me, O LORD; for I have walked in mine integrity: I have trusted also in the LORD; therefore I shall not slide. 1 Vindicate me, LORD, for I have led a blameless life; I have trusted in the LORD and have not faltered: Ask God once again to be in the center of your life and in the center of all the circumstances and events and the people that you are passing through. Ask God to judge the situation and to vindicate you and give you your rights. Tell Him, ***“I have walked in mine integrity: I have led a blameless life.*** As you trusted in the Lord and lived and are living in holiness and in the fear of the Lord, then you will not slide, neither fall nor put to shame. ***3 For thy lovingkindness is before mine eyes: and I have walked in thy truth. 3 for I have always been mindful of your unfailing love and have lived in reliance on your faithfulness.*** God knows everything about you and how you faithfully served Him and followed the truth of His Word.

2 Examine me, O LORD, and prove me; try my reins and my heart. 3 For thy lovingkindness is before mine eyes: and I have walked in thy truth. 2 Test me, LORD, and try me, examine my heart and my mind; 3 for I have always been mindful of your unfailing love and have lived in reliance on your faithfulness. Ask God to examine you and to test you, this important so that the thoughts and the motives of your heart and mind will be tested and if there is sin, weariness, or mistakes, all will be revealed and you will be confessing them and renouncing them. When you are in spiritual battles and you are attacked from different directions, you might be committing sins and shortcomings that you are not aware with, like anger, rudeness, self-righteousness, anxieties, worries, expressing fears and doubts, grumbling, complaining, and expressing impatience, negative thoughts, or careless words. All these things need to be cleared before God; to be confessed and renounced so God will be pleased and will work mightily for your behalf. At this stage of God's calling in your life, come to Him in repentance, recall with the help of The Holy Spirit all your sins and flaws, repent of them and renounce all your negative thoughts and wrong actions, decisions and steps, trusting God that He will forgive you, restore you and makes you fit to go on to finish the race that He had outlined for you.

6 I will wash mine hands in innocency: so will I compass thine altar, O LORD: 7 That I may publish with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all thy wondrous works. 6 I wash my hands in innocence, and go about your altar, LORD, 7 proclaiming aloud your praise and telling of all your wonderful deeds. As you repented and are cleansed from your sins, then your hands are clean, and you can go forward and have fellowship with God and once again as you are filled with the Holy Spirit, with joy and peace then you will sing and utter words, prayers, devotions and preach messages that will declare the wonderful work of God.

8 LORD, I have loved the habitation of thy house, and the place where thine honour dwelleth. 8 LORD, I love the house where you live, the place where your glory dwells. As you draw near to God and as you respond to His call in your life then you will find yourself building His church and the ministry that He is building on earth to reach the lost souls and to conserve the disciples. Your love to God will be manifested in the way you love His church and your dedication to be the church' servant.

4 I have not sat with vain persons, neither will I go in with dissemblers. 5 I have hated the congregation of evil doers; and will not sit with the wicked. 4 I do not sit with the deceitful, nor do I associate with hypocrites. 5 I abhor the assembly of evildoers and refuse to sit with the wicked. Once again commit yourself to God that you will not associate yourself with evil doers or with those who hate God and hate His word. Holiness and responding to God's call in your life is to be away from the wicked and their congregation, and to draw near to God. You have nothing to do with the wicked and you do not need to be in agreement to them and to their wicked deeds and compromises.

Therefore as you follow and live such a kind of life away from the path of the wicked you can confidently pray to God, ***9 Do not take away my soul along with sinners, my life with those who are bloodthirsty, 10 in whose hands are wicked schemes, whose right hands are full of bribes. 9 Gather not my soul with sinners, nor my life with bloody men: 10 In whose hands is mischief, and their right hand is full of bribes.*** The wicked in life aims for selfish gain, and desire more of worldly things. They even aim to gain that with wrong ways and methods. They might lie, steal, take or receive bribes to achieve the evil they want.

The success of your ministry and its fruitfulness is determined by your commitment to continue to live a blameless life and to keep your integrity in the things you say and do, **11 But as for me, I will walk in mine integrity: redeem me, and be merciful unto me. 11 I lead a blameless life; deliver me and be merciful to me.** The Lord shall answer your prayers and will continue to lead you, show you mercy, and deliver you out from trials and redeem you from the hands on the wicked.

My dear and beloved: The final outcome of your life as you live it for God and in accordance to His word is the following: **12 My foot standeth in an even place: in the congregations will I bless the LORD. 12 My feet stand on level ground; in the great congregation I will praise the LORD.** You will finally standing on a firm and stable ground, growing and blooming in Christ, and in the mid of His church, serving Him and declaring God's will and His purpose in the life of His church and in the life of His people.

My Prayer: *Father God I come before you in the name of Jesus, who died on the cross for my sins and rose from the death to give me eternal life. Lord I thank you for your word in **Psalm 26.** Lord at this stage of my life and service unto you, I ask you Lord to examine my heart and my mind for I desire to continue to serve you and to live in the truth of your word. Lord I repent and I renounce the following sins _____.* Lord I have the confidence to approach the throne of grace for I know that you had forgiven me. Lord vindicate me from the work of evil doers, I have nothing to do with them and their deeds. I fear your name and I trust that you will be the one to lead me to have a blameless life; deliver me and be merciful to me. My feet stand on level ground; in the great congregation I will praise the LORD and will continue to serve Him, this is my prayer in Jesus name, Amen.
