(Proverbs 27: 17)



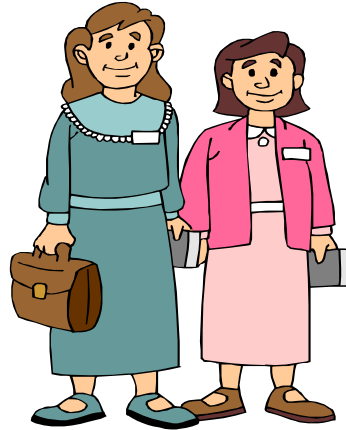
