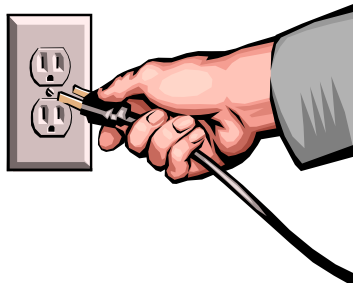


“A prudent man sees danger and takes refuge, but the simple keep going and suffer for it.” (Proverbs 22: 3)

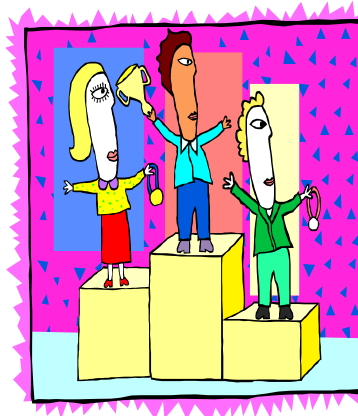
It is not enough to know information; you have to take appropriate decision and action.
