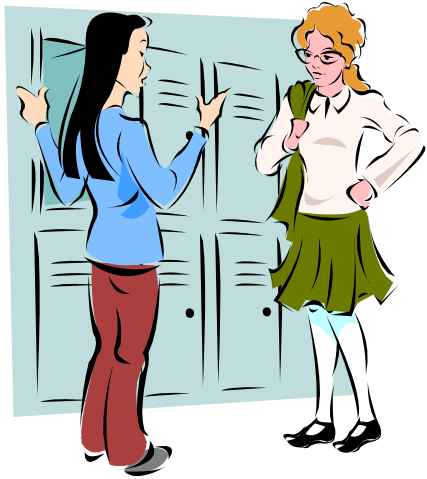


“When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise.”
