(Ecclesiastes 10:12-13)

At the end they are wicked madness: Everyone will see how his words are wickedness against God and His word.

God call you today to be cleansed in heart and mind and be pure in God's presence. Check yourself and allow the Holy Spirit to search you and to show you all your mistakes and shortcoming so you will be able to repent and receive God's blessings and be a blessing to others as you agree to pray.
