These skills had saved David from the enemy and had brought victory upon victory to the army of Israel and defended the kingdom of God from many enemies.

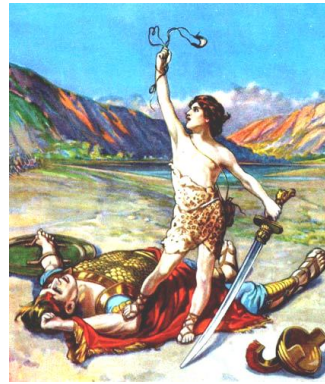
We praise the Lord for He trained our hands and fingers to go for battles and win the war. But how is that?

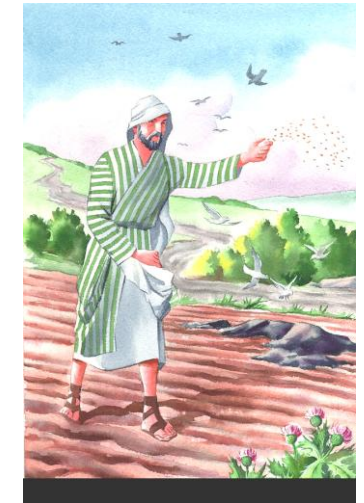
