(Psalm 25: 4)



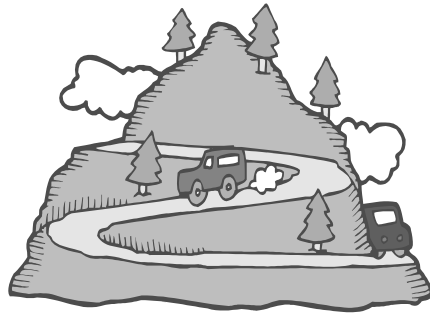
**“O what a beautiful prayer that I

Jesus; thank you Holy Spirit, Amen.**

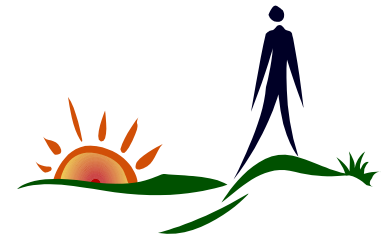
