(Ecclesiastes 10:8)



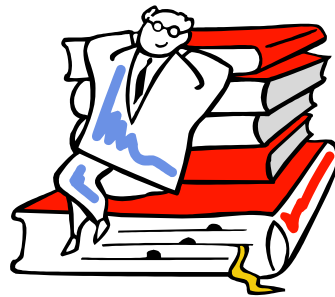

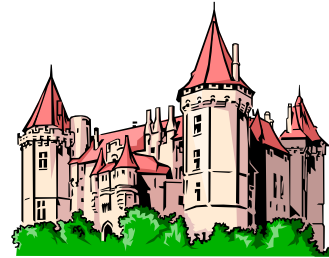
them so they will not repeat that again.
