"Has not my hands made all these things, and so they came into being?" declares the LORD. "This is the one I esteem: he who is humble and contrite in spirit, and trembles at my word." (Isaiah 66:2)



God had made everything; heaven and earth and everything on them. Then what we would give Him or make for Him that He does not have? He has done everything but what God want from man? This is what the Lord declares: **This is the one I** esteem :-

1) He who is humble: The humble is the one who can make himself nothing before God. Now human with the pride he carry always try to make himself something. You may hear people saying, I want to be rich, I want to be famous, I want to be powerful, I want to be engineer, I want to be a doctor, I want to be a Pilot, etc. But rarely you hear someone saying I want to be humble. God wants us to be humble like His Son Jesus Christ, "Who being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humble Himself and became obedient to death—even death on the cross." (Philippians 2:6-8)

2) He who is contrite in Spirit: God wants us to repent before Him for any sin we have done. God want us to say to Him when we come before Him, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." A broken and contrite heart God will not despise.

3) He who tremble at God's Word: When God speaks something we should not neglect, and when God's word command us certain thing to do and we are not practicing it we should tremble with holy fear until we observe all what God commanded.
