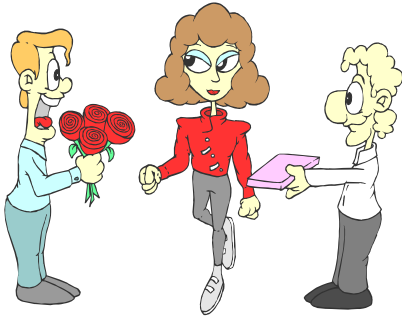


“Wealth brings many friends, but a poor man’s friend deserts him.”

This might be the reality, but should not be the truth that we follow. Wealth and riches that man may have would bring to him many friends, and many people will come to take advantage of his wealth.

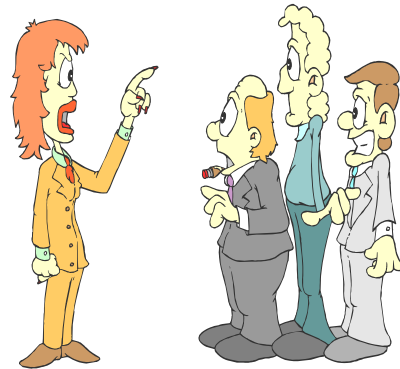
But when there is poverty and no riches people will go away. Those who are looking for material things will be no more because riches are not there.

Riches and wealth should not be the reason for us to gather around certain figures. As well as poverty should not be the reason to desert those who are financially poor.

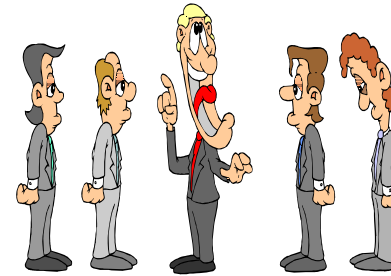
Material things should not be behind our friendship. As well as people who seek friendship with us should not be counting on what we have from material things. This is a wrong motive and ungodly privileges for friendship.
