To pamper is to give something more than what is required or ought to be. It is good to show love but it should not be more than what is assigned for. We can pamper people through giving them time, efforts, care, money, gifts, prestige, honor, authority or other privileges more than they ought to have or more than they deserve.

We can also pamper people if we only give them privileges but without proper teaching of the Word of God and without discipline.

If a man pampers his servant from youth: Those who are under you they need your love and your care, but don't spoil them. Teach them their rights as well as their duties and responsibilities. They must know that they are accountable to you to fulfill their responsibilities towards you. Those who are under you whether your servants, your household or your children they must be taught to observe to do the things that pleases the Lord and that will cause you to be happy.

Otherwise, **He will bring grief in the end:** If you pamper those who are under you, they will be spoiled and of no good testimony and of no good character. They will do evil for themselves, for others and for you, and this will bring grief in the end. Therefore be careful not to sow pampers in order for you not to reap grief.
