The same you will face and be troubled if you rely on unfaithful people in times of trouble.

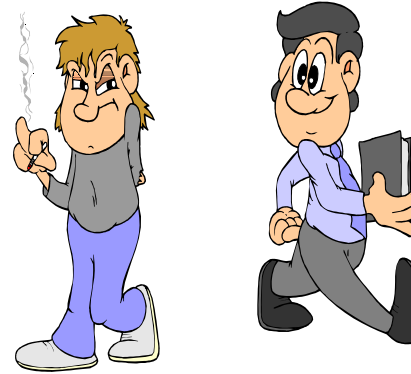
This proverb does not only teach us not to use unfaithful people in times of trouble and this is quite clear and understandable thing. But does teaches us also the following:

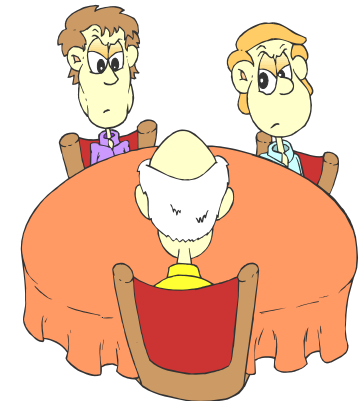
