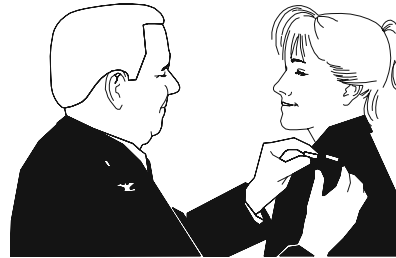
The righteous man may have certain misfortune in his life, but the misfortune will come on him on certain time but will not pursue him continuously.

But prosperity is the reward of the righteous: The righteous man may have struggles in his life but finally he will have the victory. God will reward him for his perseverance in trials and life's hardships.

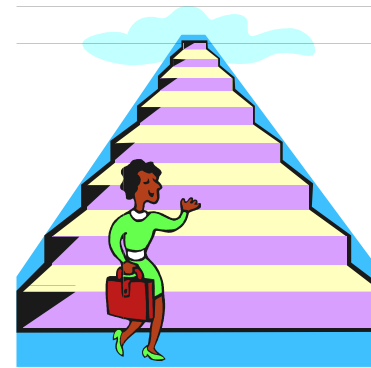
