Restore us to yourself, O LORD: A longing in the heart of the Psalmist that the Lord would restore His people to Himself; a longing to go back to the blessings of God and His canopy of guidance and protection.

The people of God they were in deep pain, trouble and distress and they want to return and go back to God; they want to return to the Lord to rule and reign over their lives.

Renew our days as of old: They want God to come back and treat them as He was treating them in the past. They realize now that there is a period of grace when God will tolerate them and be patient, but there is a time that God

will bring judgment on them and their sinful acts. **Renew our days as of old unless you have utterly rejected us and are angry with us beyond measure:** They are now aware of the consequences of their sins and God judgment on them. They realize that God might reject them.

In fact God did not reject them but He rejected their sins. He brought them to exile in order to discipline them, correct them and make them realize the value of God in their lives.

The Word of God assuring you that God's love is there, and He did not reject you, but He wants you to realize that He hates sins and He is disciplining you so you will not go back to it again, but you will be restored to Him and forever.
