"But with loud shouts they insistently demanded that he be crucified, and their shouts prevailed."

(Luke 23:23)



It does not matter how many people they will recommend something and wanted something to be done, that does not mean it is the right thing.

When there is voting they will count how many those who vote for that particular issue and how many those who disagree. Some they put a 60 or 70 percent majority if they will reach then they will approve the decision. Some they will be satisfy with the higher percentage of voting.

But one thing sure about it that the crowd is not always right. And the majority can be wrong as well.

That what had happened at the time of Jesus the crowd prevailed in requesting Pilate to crucify Jesus.

But this what the Bible says about the crowd, "Do not follow the crowd in doing wrong. When you give testimony in a lawsuit, do not pervert justice by siding with the crowd." (Exodus 23:2)

We see and notice in many rallies that there is large crowd, but most of them they don't know what they are saying and what they are doing. Most likely they will go with their emotions and their feelings. Or they may go because they are just siding with people who are their friends and sharing a common interest. But not necessarily what they do is their real opinion and stand.

The shout of the majority may prevail but that does not mean that they are doing or had chosen what is right and just.

It is a warning message for you to discern and be aware of what is going on around you; be careful and think before you open your mouth and shout with the crowd.
