## "A mocker resents correction; he will not consult the wise."

(Proverbs 15:12)



The mocker is the person who is arrogant and thinks of himself far better than other people, and who belittle others.

The mocker is the person who thinks of himself that he knows everything and he does not need to learn more or know better. That will cause him to laugh on others and look down on them especially if they will try to correct him or teach him.

The mocker is the person who has pride and that pride will build in his personality and attitude a high self esteem that will hinder him to humble himself and to go and ask help from others.

The mocker with his pride and high self esteem will react and retaliate and become angry when any one tries to correct him. He will resent and defy anyone who might say anything that contradicts his rules.

The Holy Spirit now will work in your life, open your heart to God and humble yourself to Him and ask Him to correct you and cleanse you from all your sins. You will do better and will be more blessed if you humble yourself and follow God and walk in His ways as you agree to pray.
