Whoever says to the guilty, “You are innocent,” will be cursed by peoples and denounced by nations: Such person is not doing good and not living right. Not only he is withholding the rights of the poor. But he is misleading others and put them in the wrong tract of life. People may be at the beginning be happy with the person who is agreeing with them. But later on as they suffer because of their disobedient act then will realize that the person who supported them in their wrong doings he had harmed them.

Such person will be cursed by the people and the nations because he had misled them by his compromising with God’s word and truth.
