

“1 Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. 2 Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ. 3 For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. 4 But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. 5 For every man shall bear his own burden. 6 Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things. 7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. 8 For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting. 9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. 10 As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.” (Galatians 6:1-10 KJV)

“1 Brothers, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. 2 Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. 3 If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves. 4 Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else, 5 for each one should carry their own load. 6 Nevertheless, the one who receives instruction in the word should share all good things with their instructor. 7 Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. 8 Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. 9 Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. 10 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.” (Galatians 6:1-10 NIV)

In this chosen part of Paul's letter to the Galatians church he outlined to us the dangers and pitfalls that may cause to fall in trouble: the sins that may cause us trouble: how to be helped by the body of Christ and to be restored: the way we can be blessed and the way we can be a blessing to others inside the church and outside.

1 Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Faults are mistakes that done without awareness: ***if a man be overtaken in a fault***, and he is not aware of what he did, then being part of the body of Christ, he should be surrounded by those who are spiritual who are more experienced with life with the Lord, should take their part to gently explain to him in order to restore him. ***But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.*** Watchfulness is needed from each and every one of us so that we will not be tempted. The true love of God is to love others and help them to be restored from their troubles and to love ourselves being watchful to avoid falling in the trap of the evil one.

2 Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ. 5 For every man shall bear his own burden. 2 Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. 5 for each one should carry their own load. Every member of the body of Christ had his own load or burden in regard to his responsibilities toward work family and ministry, and

he need to do them well. The person might be able to fulfill his own load or burden and up to 100 percent. But there is a time that this person is needed to be helped and supported when he is overloaded and troubled with a big burden, and here comes the responsibility of the body of Christ toward one another. Here comes the sense of being responsible toward others around you and to be ready to help them in times of their needs.

3 For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. 3 If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves. Here is warning against pride and against self-righteousness. These are not faults but sins and the believer should repent of these sins.

4 But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. 4 Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else. Check again yourself and see if you are doing well and doing your responsibilities and assignment in a proper way. Mind your own business and don't compare yourself with others. With such measures it is clear that the person should look first to himself, finding out his fault and sins, correcting himself, and receiving correction or admonishment from the spiritual members of the church to be restored back again to his own spiritual fruitful status.

6 Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things. 6 Nevertheless, the one who receives instruction in the word should share all good things with their instructor. As you receive teaching that brought blessing into your life, then in the same way you need to share the blessings that you have with those who taught you. To ***communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things*** is to make it clear to everyone that the person who taught you His labour will not be in vain. Your good testimony being changed and transformed, being committing your life to God, to His church and to your teachers, being responsible and fruitful person and being a blessing to others all will communicate great things to those who labored in serving you.

7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. 8 For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting. 7 Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. 8 Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Here is now the way to be blessed. You need to continue to sow the seed and to be a blessing to others. The more you are sowing and being blessing to others then the more you are receiving and enjoying the blessings of God and reaping eternal life. But if you live in sin and for your selfish ambition and desires then the more you are creating troubles to yourself and reaping corruption and destruction.

9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. 9 Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. We should not be tired, lazy, selfish and other factors that will prohibit us from doing good. Because we know from what we read and understood that one day we will reap harvest, therefore we should not give up.

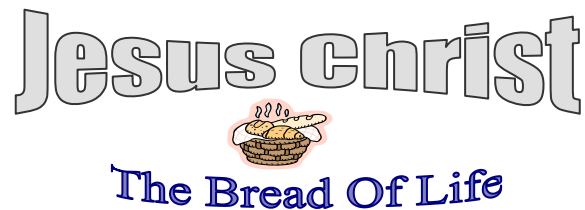
10 As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. 10 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers. Now it is obvious, that we need to continue to do good to everyone, and that is how we are evangelizing and bringing the good news of Jesus and the promise of God to all the people and the nations around us. We need to help them, guide them, assist them, and lead them in the right way of life. Then to disciple them and teach them God's ways.

Especially unto them who are of the household of faith. especially to those who belong to the family of believers As well as we need to take our full part in the body of Christ, His church, doing our responsibilities and assignments. In such a way we become a blessing to the church and that will help the church to grow and to reach others and we will be reaping further blessings.

Commit yourself to God and to the Word of God that you read in this message. God had placed a calling in your life. Go through the message and commit your life and your ways to God. You will be blessed as you agree to be a blessing to others.
